

The school was established in 1958 to cater to the educational needs of the children of the surrounding localities.

SD is an indigenous religious congregation of sisters founded by Venerable Father Varghese Payapilly who has a vision for the upliftment of our fellowmen especially the poor, abandoned and destitute.

The School is affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi w.e.f. February 1972 and managed by the Sisters of the Destitute Educational Society, Kasauli.

# **CURRICULUM**

### Nursery

This class introduces young learners to foundational skills through a joyful, play- based approach. The curriculum focuses on developing languages, motor, cognitive, and socio-emotional skills through subjects included English, Hindi, Mathematics, EVS, GK, Music, Dance, Yoga, Art and Craft.

#### I – XII

The students will be prepared for the All India Secondary School Examination (AISSE) and All India Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination (AISSCE) of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi.

The curriculum includes English, Hindi, Sanskrit, Punjabi, Mathematics, Science, Social Science, Art, Craft, Instrumental Music, Dance, Life Skills, Physical Education, Health Education, General Knowledge and Information Technology, Computer Science. The medium of instruction right from the beginning is English.

The school authorities consider it to be their duty to show due respect to the religious feelings and the freedom of conscience of their pupils belonging to various religious communities. Moral Science is taught in all classes as it aims at teaching our pupils about their duty to God, to fellow men and to self.

- 2. Fees once remitted will not be refunded in any case.
- 3. They will receive User Id and Password after registration on the registered Mobile number.
- 4. Login through the given User Id and Password.
- 5. You will be able to download the prospectus and will also find the registration form on the same portal.
- 6. Please read the necessary instructions and information given in the prospectus to fill online form.\
- 7. Fill the form online and please keep ready following scanned copies to upload online
  - a. Child's Photo (Less than 1 MB)
  - b. Aadhaar Card (Father, Mother and child Less than 1 MB)
  - c. DOB Certificate (Child Less than 1 MB)
- 8. Take a print out of the application form and submit in the school office with required documents on the date as mentioned in the prospectus.

Admission is subject to verification of original birth certificate, residence proof and other relevant documents. The Selected Candidates list will be updated on www.smcskasauli.com and also on School Notice Board on 15th December 2025. The Fee should be deposited by 18th December 2025 positively, failing which candidature shall be cancelled and the seat left vacant will be given to another candidate as the management decides.

Since ours is a Private Unaided Minority Institution, so the provisions of RTE Act and RTI act are not applicable on our institution.

#### DOCUMENTS TO BE ATTACHED WITH THE APPLICATION FORM

- 1. Self attested photocopy of Birth Certificate of the Child under Birth and Death Registration Act with Child's name and Parents name on it.
- 2. Attested photocopy of proof of residence Family I.D.(Parivar Pehchan Patra), Aadhar Card, latest electricity bill, passport, voter ID, house tax receipt (anyone in the name of child's parent).
- 3. In case the parents are residing in the rented accommodation then they should submit RENT DEED on Stamp Paper which must be attested by Notary Public and duly Registered in the Register of Notary Public with Serial No. and Stamp and it must be of prior to 01/07/2025. (No other document of residence proof is acceptable).
- 4. SC/ST Certificate of child /parents issued by the appropriate authority.
- 5. For catholic and Christians, suitable supporting documents like Baptism Certificate, a letter from the respective parish priest/pastor testifying to the membership of their parish should be attached.
- 6. Proof of Alumni i.e. photocopy of certificate of Class X/XII of same school (Duly attested).
- 7. Proof of sibling (real brother/sister only) studying in the same school i.e., photocopy of the latest fee slip.
- 8. Attested photocopies of documents relating to both parents' Highest Educational qualification only.
- 9. Attested proof of change in name of Father / Mother (If required).
- 10. In case the child is residing with single parent, please attach copy of Court order/ Guardian Certificate/ Divorce Petition filed in Court and Affidavit of Single parent, that in case of any dispute, he/she shall be solely responsible and the School will not come in the picture anywhere.

#### **Please Note:**

- 1. If the candidate is selected, his/her original Birth Certificate should be presented for verification purpose along with admission form and the receipt of admission fee paid.
- 2. Both parents must be present with the child on the day of admission as the signature of both are imperative.
- 3. If the required hard copies of the documents are not submitted along with the application form on 11thDecember 2025, the application form will be rejected and no request for the same will be entertained at any stage later on, any ground.
- 4. The school authorities reserve their right to give or not to give admission to any student, if they deem fit in the interest of the school without assigning any reason.
- 5. The school does not accept any donation or capitation fees, so the parents are requested not to give any donation or capitation fee on behalf of school to any person.
- 6. The school has no association with any of the Play Schools in any respect whatsoever.
- 7. No enquiries related to declaration of result will be entertained in the school office before the 15th of December 2025.
- 8. If the name and surname of the child and that of parents given in the application form do not match with the birth certificate of the child, the application form will be considered as incomplete and will not be considered for admission.
- 9. No alteration will be permitted in the application form once the same stands submitted in the school.
- 10. The school being a Christian minority institution reserves its constitutional right to give preference to the children from the Christian Community. Preference will also be given to Siblings, Wards of Alumni and Staff. Preference does not guarantee admission.
- 11. Being a Christian minority educational institution and an imitation of Jesus who made a preferential option for the poorest of poor of the society, the school has independently been educating the EWS/EDG (Economically Disadvantage Group). Since 1958 the institution has never stopped to look after EWS/EDG and will continue to reach out to them.
- 12. Only one application form per child will be accepted.
- 13. Forms and all the accompanying documents, once submitted, will become the property of the school and shall not be returned at any cost.
- 14. We are Private Unaided Minority Institution and have every right to admit or not to admit any student and we are also not covered under R.T.I. Act. As such as per the Judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India we can adopt our own procedure for admission and fixation of fee.
- 15. The age group that has been taken for the criteria of admission to the school is purely based on the norms prescribed by the Government.
- 16. Admission fee: Payable only once and it is not refundable.

# **Objectives of Nursery Education**

- 1. To ensure a child-friendly environment where each child is valued, respected, feels safe, secure and develops a positive self-concept. To develop good physique, adequate muscular co-ordination and basic motor skills: To achieve these objectives, opportunities for climbing, jumping, sliding, swinging, pedaling, drawing, painting, threading the beads etc. are provided.
- 2. To enable a sound foundation for good health, well-being, nutrition, healthy habits and hygiene. These skills are necessary for personal grooming of the children. Personal hygiene, healthy eating habits, dressing up themselves are a part of it. Children are encouraged to do their own work and be self-reliant. Independence and self-help are encouraged and appreciated.
- 3. To enable children become effective communicators and foster both receptive and expressive language. To develop desirable social attitudes and manners. This is achieved by encouraging the child to co-operate, share and take care of the property belonging to him/her as well as others. How to greet the teachers, elders and their friends is taught and soon imbibed by the children.
- 4. To help children become involved learners, think critically, be creative, collaborative, communicative and connect with their immediate environment.
- 5. To enable a smooth transition of children from foundational stage to preparatory stage.
- 6. To work as partners with parents and community to enable each child flourish

## **ADMISSION CRITERIA FOR CLASSES J.K.G. TO IX**

The online registration for admission to Class J.K.G to Class IX is open only if seats are available in a particular class.

Admissions at St.Mary's Convent School Kasauli are conducted on the basis of merit, and we aim to provide equal opportunities to all eligible students. We encourage parents to explore our admission process, which is transparent and designed to welcome students from diverse backgrounds.

## **Age Criteria for**

JKG	4 years and above
SKG	5 years and above
Class I	6 years and above

Applicants may complete the registration process either online or offline, as per their preference.

Admission tests will be conducted based on the syllabus of the applicant's previous class.

While our school follows the CBSE curriculum, no specific syllabus is provided for the admission test. Applicants are advised to prepare for test based on the general curriculum of their previous class.

## **ADMISSION CRITERIA FOR CLASS XI**

Streams Available in XI & XII: Commerce and Non-Medical.

Commerce- English Core, Business Studies, Accountancy, Economics.

Non-Medical- English Core, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics.

Optional subjects for both streams- Physical Education, Hindustani Music Vocal.

Skill Subjects- Information Technology, Physical Activity Trainer.

#### **Stream Eligibility Criteria:**

- Commerce Stream: A minimum of 60% marks in Mathematics and English
- Non-Medical Stream: A minimum of 75% marks in Mathematics and Science

#### Entrance test guideline for students from other schools:

Students seeking admission from other schools are required to appear for an entrance test based on their chosen stream.

Commerce Stream- Students will be given an Entrance Test in English, general paper on Social Science and General Awareness based on IX & X and Mathematics.

Non-Medical Stream- Students will be given an Entrance Test in English, Mathematics, Science.

# STEPS FOR REGISTRATION TO CLASSES I – IX, XI

- 1. Parents have to register themselves on smcskasauli.com by making online payment of Rs 2500/- as registration fees.
- 2. Fees once remitted will not be refunded in any case.

#### NOTE:

Please don't forget to mention the e-mail id on the registration form. The Entrance test date will be sent through mail.

# **ADMISSION AND WITHRAWAL**

The Academic year commences in February and culminates at the end of January of the following year inclusive of winter vacation.

#### **ADMISSION**

- 1. The management reserves to itself the right to admission.
- 2. Admission is open to all irrespective of their caste, creed or community; provided they qualify.
- 3. Children are ordinarily admitted at the beginning of the academic year.
- 4. No admission is made unless the child has passed a test in the essential subjects. (I-IX, XI)
- 5. At the time of admission Transfer Certificate, Conduct Certificate and latest Progress Report should be submitted.
- 6. Direct admission to class X and class XII is not granted.

#### WITHDRAWAL AND DISMISSAL

- 1. Parents desirous of withdrawing their ward from school must give a week notice in writing, however, the complete instalment of the fee will be charged.
- 2. If the name of a pupil who has been absent, has through lack of notification been entered in the register for the following month/months, fee is due even if the child continues to be absent.
- 3. No transfer certificate is given until all the dues of the school have been paid in full.
- 4. The school authorities reserve the right to dismiss those children from the school whose conduct is found unsatisfactory; their attendance is irregular

#### **LEAVE CRITERION**

- 1. All are expected to attend school on the first day of the academic session and the re- opening day after each vacation.
- 2. Leave applications must be submitted in the form of written leave letter or through e-mail. The prescribed format is provided at the back of the diary. For leave exceeding three days, the application must be submitted to the Principal.
- 3. Repeated absence without leave letter for more than ten consecutive days renders the student liable to have his/her name struck off the rolls.
- 4. The absentees on account of illness must present a medical certificate before they areadmitted to class.

#### **EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION**

- 1. Monthly Test, Periodic Test and Annual Examination are held in the academic year. Progress report will be given to the child after the final examination.
- 2. Any kind of malpractice in the examination is punishable with expulsion from the examination hall and subsequent cancellation of the paper or the whole examination.
- 3. Result declared at the end of the school year is final. It will not be reconsidered and final examination answer sheets will not be shown.
- 4. Children who are absent from examination, periodic test and monthly test for any reason will not be reexamined.
- 5. Children who are absent from examination, periodic test and monthly test due to illness must submit a medical certificate.
- 6. If children are unable to attend the school, they should not come only for class test and other assessments.
- 7. A minimum of 75% attendance is compulsory to be eligible to appear for the annual examination.

Promotion of the child is based on the periodic tests, monthly tests and annual examination held during the year along with performance in the class

# **FEE PAYMENT SCHEDULE**

#### **ADMISSION FEE:**

Payable only once, the fee is not refundable. This fee is to be paid at the time of admission.

#### **SCHOOL FEES**

The annual school fee should be deposited online through the Bank of Baroda & HDFC, as per the prescribed schedule. Monthly payments (March to December) must be made on or before the 10th of each month.

- 1. Online Payment can be made through e-care panel or M connect app (Bank of Baroda & HDFC). If paid through any other source (NEFT, IMPS, RTGS, Google pay) inform the school office immediately.
- 2. A late fee fine of ₹ 100/- will be charged per month whether the fee is deposited after 10th of the month.
- 3. The name of the student will be struck off from the School Roll for non-payment of the fee consecutively for three months.
- 4. All fees for the academic year must be cleared in full before a student is permitted to appear for the final examination.
- 5. No reduction in the fee will be granted for any period of absence.
- 6. The Progress Report of students with outstanding fee payment will be withheld until all dues are cleared.
- 7. School Fee once paid will not be refunded.

No cash will be accepted in School office.

#### **CODE OF CONDUCT**

Students must arrive on time, attend all classes, and maintain discipline throughout the school day.

Electronic devices like mobile phones, smartwatches, and tablets are strictly prohibited on school premises.

Respectful behavior towards teachers, staff and classmates is expected at all times, both in and outside the school.

Speaking and communicating in English is required within the school and during all school activities.

Students should never bring or use dangerous items, such as crackers or explosives, and must keep the school environment safe and clean.

Any form of bullying, shouting, or disruptive conduct is not allowed; students should always walk and act quietly and politely.

Take care of school property and keep the premises clean; damaging or defacing school property is strictly forbidden.

Buying, selling, using or possessing any kind of drugs is not acceptable and is strictly forbidden.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS TO PARENTS**

Maximum co-operation between the parents and the school authorities is necessary for securing all that is the best in the education of the child.

- 1. Parents are requested to check the school diary regularly and sign the occasional report and notices from the teachers, as a proof that they have read them.
- 2. Children should do their homework by themselves. It is important that the children develop a habit of studying on their own.
- 3. Criticism of a teacher should be avoided in the presence of the child because it undermines respect for the teachers and the school. If you have a legitimate complaint, meet the Principal.
- 4. Parents, guardians or other persons are not allowed to see the children or meet their teacher, during school hours without the prior permission of the Principal. They are requested to bring their complaints directly to the Principal and not to any member of the staff.
- 5. It may also be understood that the school will take all possible care and precautions to safeguard the children when they are in school campus. However, the school will not be responsible for any mishap beyond its control in the school.
- 6. Parent -Teacher Meeting will be conducted once every two months. Parents should make it a point to take this opportunity to discuss the progress of their children.
- 7. Comments made by parent in diary should be confined strictly to the students work and conduct. All other matters concerning school should be dealt separately. They are to be either conveyed personally or through separate letters/emails addressed to the Head of the school.
